Protecting Faith, Family and Freedom

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Questions for school-board trustee candidates

1. Do you believe parents are the primary caregivers and educators of their children and should be kept meaningfully informed about significant matters affecting their children at school?
2. Will you support maximum transparency for parents concerning curriculum, classroom materials, library resources, surveys, presentations, guest speakers, clubs, and special programs?
3. Should parents receive advance notice and given an opportunity to withdraw their child from instruction involving sensitive religious, sexual, or moral subjects?
4. Will you oppose school-board policies that require students or staff to affirm ideological, political, or religious beliefs rather than simply treating every person with dignity and respect?
5. Do you support freedom of religion and conscience for Christian students and staff, including the right to express lawful beliefs without being punished merely because others disagree?
6. Will you defend students' ability to form Christian clubs or faith-based student groups on the same terms as other student organizations?
7. Should schools remain politically neutral rather than promoting partisan causes or controversial political movements?
8. Should school flagpoles be reserved for official governmental or school-board flags rather than flags representing political, ideological, religious, or advocacy causes? Why or why not?
9. What safeguards should exist to ensure that books and materials made available to children are age-appropriate, particularly where they contain sexual content?
10. Should parents have easy online access to school-library catalogues and instructional materials?
11. Do you believe biological sex is relevant in some school policies involving privacy, athletics, change rooms, washrooms, and overnight accommodation? How would you protect the dignity and privacy of every student?
12. What is your position on parental notification when a minor child asks school personnel to make significant changes concerning the child's identity, name, or other personal matters?
13. Will you support policies protecting students from bullying while also protecting freedom of speech, religion, and conscience?
14. Do you support teachers adhering to a neutral and established curriculum rather than using their position in the classroom to interject political or ideological doctrine?

15. Will you support academic excellence—including literacy, numeracy, science, history, civics, skilled trades, and financial literacy—as the central mission of the school system? What is your plan for its implementation?
16. What specific school-board policy would you change to strengthen parental involvement, student safety, academic achievement, or freedom of conscience?
